Reflection: : This weekend's Gospel tells the story of a man who wanted more in his life. He didn't want more money. Anyone who could afford to part with so much didn't want for a penny. He didn't want more work. As a tax collector, he had plenty of that. He didn't want more status. Otherwise, he wouldn't have been climbing trees. Jesus, with the eye of God, spotted what Zacchaeus did want. He spotted the isolation of Zacchaeus, up a tree, out on a limb, on his own. Had we been there, we might have questioned Zacchaeus about how he did his job as a tax collector. We might have blamed him for the greed that was his downfall. We might have said that Zacchaeus made himself unwanted and unpopular. Jesus skipped over these issues. He didn't lecture Zacchaeus. Rather, Jesus invited himself to the house of Zacchaeus. Zacchaeus went from being a man excluded to being a man included. In the Gospel according to Luke, we hear how the lost Son is found and the woman frowned on by others for her past is accepted by Jesus. We learn from Jesus that those who need rescue from fear, from isolation, from their past, or from whatever others might judge as shortcoming in their lives will find that God is a God of welcome and a God who includes.
