LAUDATO SI - A Summary of Pope Francis' Encyclical

Pope Francis calls us to dialogue about 'Our Common Home.'

1. He offers us a Spiritual perspective.
2. He stresses the disproportionate effect of environmental change on the poor.
3. He aims criticism at the 'Technocrat mindset' which ignores consequences for earth and the poor.
4. This encyclical is authoritative teaching continuing the Church's social teaching.
5. Talk about ecology can be grounded in the Bible. The call to care for Creation goes back to Genesis.
6. He states that everything is connected and that all of us are linked to creation. Our decisions effect the environment.
7. Pope Francis builds on the latest scientific findings-re climate change, pollution, waste and water.
8. He criticises the selfishness and indifference of the wealthy who ignore the poor and the common good.
9. He wants global dialogue and calls for solidarity around the world.
10. He says that every person is called to a new way of looking at Creation. We must listen to the Cry of the Earth and the Cry of the Poor. In religious language we are called to conversion.
