**Reflection ~ Irish Bishops' Conference June 2013** (extract re: G8 Summit)

Bishops discussed the values that inform our choices in matters of social and economic policy, and they underlined the need for the value of solidarity to be the guiding principle in decisions currently facing world leaders.....

Bishops wished to add their voices to those calling for greater transparency in matters of finance and taxation and stated that the protection of the rights of the poorest and most vulnerable is not only a question of charity, but is primarily a question of justice. It is a responsibility arising from our duty to care for our neighbour..... Trócaire, the overseas development agency of the Irish Bishops' Conference, has called for action to address structural injustices that have contributed to one billion people going hungry every day.....

Bishops concluded, ***"We pray that the forthcoming G8 summit will be a fruitful and productive experience, bringing us closer to peace and prosperity throughout the world."***
