Reflection

This weekend we mark the opening of the 'Week of Prayer for Christian Unity'. Sunday is also World Migrant Day' and we are asked to be conscious of those who, for whatever reason, find themselves no longer living in the land they were born in. Those who are migrants often feel like strangers and foreigners in the land they eventually find themselves living in. It can take a long time to adjust and settle. We can also often feel like strangers in a foreign land when entering the places of worship that belong to other Christian traditions. There is a reason why Christ commanded us to love and why Christ prayed too that "we might all be one". Whether we are separated by our place of birth and the customs or traditions we grew up in or whether we are separated by our theology and understanding of the Scriptures or the Sacraments we should still be united in one heart. We are, all of us, ultimately sisters and brothers, children of the one God. We should never treat each other as strangers but rather, as family we have not yet come to know. Whether we are separated by borders or by religious tradition we should be united in love, love for one another and love for God who calls us to be His family. Let us never treat those we meet as strangers or foreigners.

Let us "love one another as Christ has loved us". May no one ever feel like a 'foreigner' in our company.
