SUMMARY OF PRESENT REGULATIONS RE FUNERALS DURING COVID-19 PANDEMIC

In line with present guidance, Social Distancing is to be observed. The present regulations encourage the general public to refrain from attending on the street outside, unless there is an exceptional reason.

(a) Wakes, Funerals & Burials are Private to close family members and close family friends ONLY.

(b) Funeral Mass: (i) Face Masks should be worn inside the church; (ii) Only family mourners permitted; (iii) close family friends only by arrangement with undertaker; (iv) no physical interaction between sanctuary/altar area and the body of the church (no readers, no other forms of participation); (v) music by soloists only; (vi) anyone who is feeling even slightly unwell should remain at home for fear of infecting others

(c) The Rite of Christian Burial is held at the graveside, with only 30 mourners present. The general public should be absent.



In Memoriam Monsignor Seán Cahill, RIP 25th April 1934 - 20th July 2020 Parish Priest of St Michael's Parish 1981 - 2007 Vicar General 1981 - 2010

Monsignor Cahill is lovingly and gratefully remembered as a wonderful Pastor to parishioners. He is a tremendous example of what a priest can be and of what a priest can do.

In the first place, he helped people to celebrate the central events of their lives: the births, the marriages and the deaths. He ministered the sacraments of God's forgiveness and healing. And he saw to it that these events were celebrated in the most uplifting surroundings possible. The present beauteous condition of both St Michael's Church and St Mary's Church today was re-established under his stewardship. In

that, he has left a wonderful legacy to us all. Our churches are regularly photographed and visited. They stand witness to what human beings can achieve, despite all.

Monsignor Cahill was also a minister of God for the whole community. When the town was hit by the cruel events of November 1987, he sought to foster and maintain the bond of unity across the community. If there is one word that is regularly used to describe him, it is the word 'gentleman'. He was graceful in his interactions with others, never stilted or aloof, always respectful and considerate. In this, he set a headline for us all to follow.

A parish priest has a significant amount of background work to do in keeping up the fabric and the goods of the parish. Monsignor Cahill came to a parish where there was so much to do. He established the Parish Draw, with its characteristically generous prizes. To this day, it remains a mainstay in maintaining our parish patrimony.

Finally, Monsignor Cahill served us also at a diocesan level as Vicar General to two of our Bishops - Bishop Joseph Duffy and Bishop Liam MacDaid - over nearly thirty years. It's easy to discount the level of the shocks and stresses of those days. Through it all, Monsignor Cahill offered them sage and wise advice. At the same level, he is held in high esteem for the outstanding contribution he made to Catholic Education. He brought together the then two town primary schools - St Theresa's and St Michael's - into one school: Holy Trinity Primary School. He was very happy to hear of the new capital build project recently announced.

That both Archbishops of Armagh sent condolences and remembrance on the death of Monsignor Cahill is a sign that his renown reaches far. And yet, for all that, it is ultimately his fatherly kindness and his capacity to engage with people for which he will be fondly and lovingly remembered. May he rest in peace.

Many people helped in caring for Monsignor Cahill in his final years, particularly when he returned to reside here some two years ago. He never wanted for any attention or friendship that could be offered in his daily life, in travelling to appointments, in hospital care, in nursing care, and in his final hours of palliative care.
