

REVISED MESSAGE FROM MONSIGNOR PETER REGARDING COVID-19 PANDEMIC

As the call on our generosity continues, and as we continue to heed the message to 'Stay At Home' for the sake of our NHS Staff and for the sake of people who are at high risk of ill health, please be assured of our continuing prayers in St Michael's Parish. This is a time of test, yes; it is also a time of grace, which when responded to generously will bear fruit in our souls.

The following changes in our parish arrangements will apply at this time:

- 1. Mass Arrangements: Parish Masses in St Michael's Church will continue and will be accessible to parishioners only over the Parish Webcam, via the Parish Website (on http://saintmichaels-parish.com/webcam.asp) or directly through MCN Media, who provide the service (on https://www.mcnmedia.tv/camera/st-michaels-parish-eniskillen). Apologies, but that's how they misspelt Enniskillen in the website ad-
- 2. Lisbellaw Mass: The 9.30am Sunday morning Mass at St Mary's Church remains suspended. The intentions for this Mass will be included in the 10.30am Sunday Mass in St Michael's Church.
- 3. Convent Mass: This 6pm Monday evening Mass and its intention is transferred to St Michael's Church. No congregation permitted.
- 4. Eucharistic Adoration: This will continue but only by webcam at this time.
- 5. The Parish Office: The Office is now closed. Emails, telephone messages and delivered letters will be checked once a day. Please leave a message on the answering service at (028) 6632-2075 then press 4 for Father Raymond; 6 for Monsignor Peter.
- 6. Sunday Collections: In this time especially, Parishioners are asked to kindly consider setting up a Standing Order with their bank by means of the Standing Order (included in last week's Messenger). Copies of this form can only be downloaded from the parish website at this time. This is really important to the parish in order to help us to continue paying our way. It would be really helpful if parishioners in a position to do this would kindly do so. If you need help or advice with completing this Standing Order form, please leave a message on the Parish Phone for the attention of Fr Raymond (phone 028-6632-2075, press 4)
- 7. The Sick and the Housebound: Those normally visited by the Priest will receive a telephone call to offer a prayer with them at this time. Please let us know if we can help in any way or if there is someone in our community who needs support. Simply phone or email.

8. Weddings and Baptisms: These are now suspended until further notice.

9. Funerals: Until further notice, the following Civil Regulations apply: (1) Undertakers are to bring the body of a deceased parishioner directly to the place of burial, without going to the Church. (2) There is to be no public wake. (3) At the Graveyard, the maximum permitted number of attendees is 10 persons. (4) The usual graveside prayer will be led by a priest or deacon (or, if necessary, a lay person). Regarding parish arrangements: parishioners who die will be remembered at our Morning Masses. Mass can be viewed on the Internet at www.saintmichaels-parish.com/webcam.asp. There is an option to have a Funeral Mass celebrated at a later date, when this crisis has passed. When sending messages of condolence, please consider using

social media or a letter.
