
SUMMARY OF PRESENT REGULATIONS RE FUNERALS DURING COVID-19 PANDEMIC

In line with present guidance, **the general public should remain away from funerals**. (https://www.nidirect.gov.uk/articles/coronavirus-covid-19-guidance-bereaved-about-funeral-arrangements)

- (a) Wakes, Funerals & Burials are Private to close family members ONLY. Others should keep away from outside & inside the church.
- (b) Funeral Mass: (i) Only 10 family mourners permitted; (ii) no physical interaction between sanctuary/altar area and the body of the church (no readers, no music, no other forms participation); (iii) anyone who is feeling even slightly unwell should remain at home for fear of infecting others.
- (c) The Rite of Christian Burial is held at the graveside, with only 10 family mourners present. The general public should be absent.

Congregations at Mass

The headline announcement about a limited return of congregations has been made. The actual regulations will follow shortly. It would be important - to ensure compliance - to leave some time at least for consideration of those regulations before making and announcing the arrangements for reopening itself.

Guidelines have been issued by the Irish Catholic Bishops Conference in anticipation of the return of this (limited) congregational return. They centre around the making of practical arrangements in relation to hygiene and appropriate distancing for such a gathering. (We already have some of such things in place in relation to the limited reopening for personal prayer.)

In whatever we do, a bigger issue remains: the virus itself. Locally speaking, most of us escaped contracting the contagion but, unfortunately, that means that the majority of us have absolutely no immunity to it. It would be important to avoid false and unfounded confidence. The danger remains real, because of what the virus can do to a person, especially those with underlying conditions. So as to avoid people taking the risk (however small) of attending in person at this time, the Conference of Irish Bishops continues to suspend the obligation to attend Sunday worship in person. We know now from abroad the virus can quickly return and take hold to cruel effect.

For those reasons, parishioners (especially those with underlying conditions) are advised to continue to participate by means of the Internet at this time. "Safer At Home" is a good motto for the present times. And should people be in any sense unwell, or have underlying conditions, or be undergoing treatments of any kind, they would be wiser to remain indoors. At root, this precaution is not just about looking after ourselves and our own wants and needs; it is also about minimising the risk to others, and also the risk of another lockdown. Many of us are already feeling it has gone on long enough and don't wish to see it return, which it surely will if we are careless at this stage.

Impatience may make us feel like we are done with this virus. Yet the bigger question remains as to whether this virus is done with us.

Cautious & Limited Reintroduction of Time for Personal Prayer within St Michael's Church

Last Monday came the announcement from the civil authorities that subject to certain conditions being met churches are permitted to reopen for personal prayer only. (Public congregations in churches are still not permitted.) Subject to restrictions outlined below, St Michael's Church will reopen briefly between 10.30am and 2.30pm from Monday to Saturday of next week.

People are advised that pandemic conditions still exist. People are asked to think of others by following restrictions. The fact remains that this virus is still being unknowingly transmitted and is still causing the death of some people, especially those with underlying pre-existent conditions, as well as a significant proportion of those over 70 years of age. Caution and precaution are still required. If you feel in any way unwell before you visit the church, please stay at home: you would safer and so would everyone else. The opening of the church at this time will depend on visitors following the guidelines below:

Opening Days: Monday to Saturday only. (Closed Sunday)

Opening Hours: 10.30am to 2.30pm only.

Entrance: The side door nearest the Parish Office. (Main door remains shut.)

Exit: The only exit is by the other side door, nearest the clergy house.

Maximum Number: Only ten (10) people allowed in the church at any one time. (Ushers will not admit more.)

Contact Details: Visitors are encouraged to leave contact details (in case needed).

Ushers: Please follow the directions of the ushers re using hand gel.

Seating: Sit only in the designated places against the church wall. (Benches not to be used at this time.)

Bring Sanitary Wipes: Use these to wipe the designated space where you sit. Leave after 10 Minutes: For this initial period (to allow others safe access).

These guidelines may change over time depending on the safety or otherwise of the situation.

The clergy of the parish would like to express their sincere thanks to parishioners at home and away for their kindness and encouragement at this time. People have been most supportive and thoughtful towards us in this anxious experience of isolation. It is appreciated. Thank you for your unselfish consideration of others in the way you have observed the restrictions at this time.
