First Reading

My dove, hiding in the clefts of the rock, in the coverts of the cliff, show me your face, let me hear your voice; for your voice is sweet and your face is beautiful". My Beloved is mine and I am his. Set me like a seal on you heart, like a seal on you arm. For love is strong as Death, jealously relentless as Sheol. The flash of it is a flash of fire, a flame of the Lord himself. Love no flood can quench, no torrents drown.

Option 2

A reading from the book of Genesis

Responsorial Psalm (sung)

Alternatively, it may be preferable for all to sing together a suitable Hymn or Anthem.

Alternatively you may ask someone to read one of the following options.

If you are not using one of the following texts, simply delete them all.

Option 1

Response: The Lord is compassion and love

My soul, give thanks to the Lord, all my being, bless his holy name. My soul, give thanks to the Lord and never forget all his blessings. (R)

The Lord is compassion and love, slow to anger and rich in mercy.
As a father has compassion on his sons, the Lord has pity on those who fear him. (R)

The love of the Lord is everlasting upon those who hold him in fear; his justice reaches out to children's children when they keep his covenant in truth. (R)

Option 2

Response: The Lord fills the earth with his love

For this reason I bow my knees before the Father, from whom every family in heaven and on earth takes its name. I pray that, according to the riches of his glory, he may grant that you may be strengthened in your inner being with power through his Spirit, and that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith, as you are being rooted and grounded in love. I pray that you may have the power to comprehend, with all the saints, what is the breadth and length and height and depth, and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, so that you may be filled with all the fullness of God.

A reading from the first letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians

Be ambitious for the higher gifts. And I am going to show you a way that is better than any of them. If I have the gift of prophecy, understanding all the mysteries there are, and knowing everything, and if I have faith in all its fullness, to move mountains, but without love, then I am nothing at all. If I give away all that I possess, piece by piece, and if I even let them take my body to burn it, but am without love, it will do me no good whatever. Love is always patient and kind; it is never jealous; love is never boastful or conceited; it is never rude or selfish; it does not take offence, and is not resentful. A reading from St Paul's letter to the Ephesians

He made her clean by washing her in water with a form of words, so that when he took her to himself she would be glorious, with no speck or wrinkle or anything like that, but holy and faultless. In the same way, husbands must love their wives as they love their own bodies; for a man to love his wife is for him to love himself. A man never hates his own body, but feeds it and looks after it; and that is the way Christ treats the Church, because it is his body - and we are its living parts. For this reason, a man must leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two will become one body. This mystery has many implications; but I am saying it applies to Christ and the Church.

P A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

 \boldsymbol{C} Glory to you, O Lord. There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee. The mother of Jesus was there, and Jesus and his disciples had also been invited. When they ran out of wine, since the wine provided for the wedding was all finished, the mother of Jesus said to him. "They have no wine." Jesus said, "Woman, why turn to me? My hour has not come yet." His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells vou." There were six water jars standing there, meant for the ablutions that are customary among the Jews: each could hold twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to the servants, "Fill the jars with water", and they filled them to the brim. "Draw some out now," he told them, "and take it to the steward." They did this; the steward tasted the water, and it had turned into wine. Having no idea where it came from - only the servants who had drawn the water knew - the steward called the bridegroom and said, "People generally serve the best wine first, and keep the cheaper sort till the guests have had plenty to drink: but you have kept the best wine till now." This was the first of the signs given by Jesus: it was given at Cana in Galilee. He let his glory be seen, and his disciples believed in him. The Gospel of the Lord.

Therefore, everyone who listens to these words of mine and acts on them will be like a sensible man who built his house on rock. Rain came down, floods rose, gales blew and hurled themselves against the house, and it did not fall: it was founded on rock. But everyone who listens to these words of mine and does not act on them will be like a stupid man who built his house on sand. Rain came down, floods rose, gales blew and struck that house, and it fell; and what a fall it had"! Jesus had now finished what he wanted to say, and his teaching made a deep impression on the people because he taught them with authority, and not like their own scribes.

The Homily

THE RITE OF MARRIAGE

There are three parts to the Rite of Marriage: (1) The Address in which the couple to be married publicly declare that their acceptance of what they undertake; (2) the Declaration of Consent in which the couple give their consent to be married to each other; and (3) the Blessing and Exchange of Rings. The priest conducts this Rite. There are a number of options from which to choose for each of these parts.

The Address

Option 1

P Dear children of God, you have come to this church so that the Lord may seal your love in the presence of the priest and of this community. Christ blesses this love. He has already consecrated you in baptism; now,

by a special sacrament, he strengthens you to fulfil the duties of your married life.

N and N, you are about to celebrate this sacrament.

Have you come here of your own free will and choice and without compulsion to marry each other?

Both: We have.

P Will you love and honour each other in marriage all the days of your life?

Both: We will

P Are you willing to accept with love the children God may send you and bring them up in accordance with the law of Christ and his church?

Both: We are.

Option 2

P Dear children of God, you have come to this church so that the Lord may seal your love in the presence of the priest and of this community.

Christian marriage is a sacred union which enriches natural love. It binds those who enter it to be faithful to each other for ever; it creates between them a bond that endures for life and cannot be broken; it demands that they love and honour each other, that they accept from God the children he may give them, and bring them up in his love.

To help them in their marriage the husband and wife receive the life-long grace of the sacrament.

Is this your understanding of marriage?

Both: It is.

The Declaration of Consent

P I invite you then to declare before God and his Church, your consent to become husband and wife.

Option 1

The Blessing & Exchange of Rings

Option 1

Lord. bless N and N and consecrate their married life. P

May these rings be a symbol of their faith in each other and

a reminder of their love. Through Christ our Lord.

Both: Amen.

Option 2

Lord, bless these rings. Grant that those who wear them may always be P faithful to each other. May they do your will and live in peace with you and in mutual love. Through Christ our Lord.

Both: Amen.

N: N, wear this ring as a sign of our faithful love, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

N: N, wear this ring as a sign of our faithful love, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. The Groom may give the Bride a token or small gift and may say the following:

N: I give you this gold and silver, tokens of all I possess. (or: I give you this gift, a token of all I possess)

Hymn/Anthem

This would be an appropriate moment for all to worship God in song together. During this hymn the couple may light their Marriage Candle

The Lighting of the Individual Candles (optional)

N & N now light the marriage candle to represent their unity in marriage.

The Prayer of the Faithful

(Some five or six of the following prayers may be read by guests or friends or family members as desired by the couple. They may also be read by the Minister.)

P Now that N and N have given themselves to each other in Christian Marriage let us ask God our Father to keep them and all married couples faithful to him, and united in themselves.

Option 1

R For N and N that the Lord, who has brought them to this happy day, will keep them forever in fidelity and love. Lord hear us:

C Lord graciously hear us.

Option 2

R For their parents of N and N, for their friends and all who have helped them to become husband and wife, Lord hear us:

C Lord graciously hear us.

Option 3

R For the world and its peoples that the Lord may bless them with his peace and the protection of his love. Lord hear us:

C Lord graciously hear us.

Option 4

R For our community and our families, who welcome Christ into their lives; that they may learn to receive him in the poor and suffering people of the world. Lord hear us:

C Lord graciously hear us.

Option 5

R For God's Church, the Bride of Christ, that it may be united in faith and love, Lord hear us:

C Lord graciously hear us.

Option 6

R For all who are victims of injustice, and for those deprived of love and affection, Lord hear us:

C Lord graciously hear us.

Option 7

R For married couples everywhere that their lives will be an example to the world of unity, fidelity and love, Lord hear us:

C Lord graciously hear us.

Option 8

R For those who mourn, while we are rejoicing, that in their suffering and loneliness they may experience the strength of God's support, Lord hear

us:

C Lord graciously hear us.

Option 9

R We remember those departed from us in this life, and especially those whom we, ourselves, have loved: that God will one day unite us again in the joys of our eternal home, Lord hear us:

C Lord graciously hear us.

The Nuptial Blessing

(The Priest or Minister continues with the Nuptial Blessing as follows:)

Option 1

Let us humbly invoke by our prayers, dear brothers and sisters, God's blessing upon this bride and groom,

that in his kindness he may favour with his help

those on whom he has bestowed the Sacrament of Matrimony.

All pray silently for a short while.

Then the priest continues:

Holy Father, maker of the whole world, who created man and woman in your own image

and willed that their union be crowned with your blessing, we humbly beseech you for these your servants, who are joined today in the Sacrament of Matrimony.

May your abundant blessing, Lord, come down upon this bride, N and upon N, her companion for life, and may the power of your Holy Spirit set their hearts aflame from on high, so that, living out together the gift of Matrimony, they may (adorn their family with children and) enrich the Church.

In happiness may they praise you, O Lord, in sorrow may they seek you out; may they have the joy of your presence to assist them in their toil, and know that you are near to comfort them in their need; let them pray to you in the holy assembly and bear witness to you in the world, and after a happy old age, together with the circle of friends that surrounds them, may they come to the Kingdom of Heaven. Through Christ our Lord.

C Amen

Option 2

Holy Father, who formed man in your own image, male and female you created them, so that as husband and wife, united in body and heart, they might fulfil their calling in the world;

O God, who, to reveal the great design you formed in your love, willed that the love of spouses for each other should foreshadow the covenant you graciously make with your people, so that, by fulfilment of the sacramental sign, the mystical marriage of Christ with his Church might become manifest in the union of husband and wife among your faithful;

Graciously stretch out your right hand over these your servants N and N, we pray, and pour into their hearts the power of the Holy Spirit.

Grant, O Lord, that, as they enter upon this sacramental union, they may share with one another the gifts of your love and, by being for each other a sign of your presence, become one heart and one mind.

May they also sustain, O Lord, by their deeds the home they are forming and prepare their children to become members of your heavenly household by raising them in the way of the Gospel.

Graciously crown with your blessings your daughter N, so that, by being a good wife and mother, she may bring warmth to her home with a love that is pure and adorn it with welcoming graciousness.

Bestow a heavenly blessing also, O Lord, on N, your servant, that he may be a worthy, good and faithful husband and a provident father.

Grant, holy Father, that, desiring to approach your table as a couple joined in Marriage in your presence, they may one day have the joy of taking part in your great banquet in heaven. Through Christ our Lord.

Protect our marriage. Bless our home.
Make us gentle. Keep us faithful.

And when life is over unite us again where parting is no more in the kingdom of your love. There we will praise you in the happiness and peace of our eternal home.
